PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

Botched Paintings Make Me Better By Ralph F. Wilson, WASH President

Earlier this week I botched another painting of Sherry's Pond, a beautiful spot tucked away in Rocklin south of I-80. I've tried three times to paint this charming little man-made lake, and three times I've come away frustrated. Most recently, I pretended that the gray pines surrounding the little lake were changing color to brilliant scarlet in autumn. Let's say that the idea was substantially better than the execution.

So I tell myself that botched paintings make me better. It sounds like a lame excuse -- and it partly is. But consider:

- I learn more from my mistakes than I do from my successes. There is an important caveat, however. I learn only if I'll take time to figure out what I did wrong and how I can do it better next time. Just repeating the same mistakes doesn't count for much.
- My early successes are largely flukes. I can choose to duplicate those successes by analyzing them to create a winning formula. But that often leads to a deadend repetitive style and a fear of doing anything new and adventurous. To get beyond paint-by-number formulas I must try new things and risk some failure in the process.
- 3. I can only improve by "putting miles on my brush," as someone put it. There are no real shortcuts. God-given talent is real, but unless I work hard to improve upon my native talent, I won't get much farther. Chopin was an amazingly-gifted pianist as a young boy, but if he had



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 refused to practice diligently we would never know his name today. One of my teachers told us that after producing 1,000 paintings we might get pretty good.

My current project is for my friend Ken, who has commissioned me to me to paint a half-sheet landscape from a photo he took on a trip with his wife a few years ago. I just hope that I've learned enough from the botched paintings of my past to be able paint something that will evoke for him the pleasant memories he associates with his day at this Washington State lavender farm. If so, those failed paintings will have been worth it.

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
JANUARY MEMBERS MEETING AND DEMONSTRATION
