

MEETING & DEMO NEWS:

Join us for Monday, March 10th's, demonstration with **Anselm Yew**.

Anselm attended the Academy of Art College in San Francisco in the late 90s. He focused first on 3-D animation, then 2-D. After many fruitful years doing 2-D animation for ads, games, cartoons, and multimedia, Anselm drifted to digital illustration. Here, he developed concept art for mobile games. Eventually, in an attempt to expand his portfolio, he started getting into gouache and watercolor in his free time. His beautiful colors capture the landscape, cityscape, and people.

Anselm analyzes each of his paintings by breaking objects into abstract shapes. He starts with the largest shape and then progresses to the smallest. Next, Anselm tries to perceive areas of contrast, then of temperature, and finally, color. He considers where to place soft and hard edges. Anselm continually strives to learn and discover.
